Final TPM

The Youth Regained partners met in Valladolid (Spain) in December of 2023, to work together on the final chapters and deliverables for the project. This included a discussion on dissemination and piloting, as well as the local multiplier events undertaken by all partners.





Final Events - Multiplier events

In January 2024, each project partner hosted an event in their country to present the YOUTH REGAINED project results. This event was a national introduction to the project for its target groups and stakeholders. It's a crucial step before fully using the initiative' materials after they've been validated.

Romania

The multiplier event of the Youth Regained project was organised and moderated by CPIP on 30 January 2024, from 10.00-14.00 at the Atlas Hotel in Timisoara. The main objective of the event was to present the aims, objectives, results and activities of the project. The main results of the project - the good practice guide, the e-course, the policy toolkit and the training - were presented, with a focus on the role of the professionals in the field regarding the social reintegration of young people and minors or persons at risk of committing crimes or reoffending.





Cyprus

The multiplier event of the Youth Regained project was organised and moderated by SYNTHESIS Center for Research and Education at Nicosia, Cyprus, on Friday, 12th January 2024. The event was titled "Reframing attitudes of minors and youth at risk of offending: an EU perspective from the Youth Regained project". The aim of this gathering was to showcase the projects, their outcomes, as well as the crucial issues surrounding juvenile infractions and the crucial role that professionals play in the societal reintegration of those affected by it.





Greece

The multiplier event of the Youth Regained project was organised and moderated by KMOP at the Impact Hub place in Athens on Friday, 26th January 2024 from 17:00 to 19:30. The event was titled "Youth and Delinquency: Social Reintegration and the Role of Professionals". This gathering focused on presenting the projects, its results as well as the critical themes of juvenile delinquency and the essential roles professionals play in the social reintegration of affected youths. Antonis Klapsis, Vice President of KMOP and Associate Professor at the University of Peloponnese, led the coordination and moderation of the event, ensuring a structured and insightful dialogue on the subject matter.





Spain

The Multiplier Event held by Acción Laboral in Spain, had the general objective of disseminating the project products and more specifically the training and curriculum, the YOUTH REGAINED good practice guide, the e-course and the awareness raising and policy toolkit.

Acción Laboral wanted to create an open space for experience sharing, in which the project was not only presented but in which we could discuss future challenges for our target group and in which professionals could share their experience and the intended use for these materials.





Ireland

Redial prepared an agenda to reflect the desire to open dialogue and encourage peer learning. We held the event at The Guinness Store House conference centre, a central location, iconic to encourage a strong presence and attendance. The room, designed to promote table working, stimulate conversation and access to the tools and resources produced by the project.

REDIAL set up our multiplier event to be an active participation group, a mixture of presentation, introduction to results produced in the project but then the largest space in the agenda, dedicated to peer discussion, exchange and networking.



Lithuania





The Multiplier Event in Lithuania was organised by SIF and aimed to disseminate the project products and more specifically the training and curriculum, the YOUTH REGAINED good practice guide, the e-course and the awareness raising and policy toolkit, namely the deliverables of PR1, PR2 and PR3. The multiplier event was organised in the form of a dissemination event and of a workshop session, for the Youth Regained stakeholders - professionals, working in the system of justice with youth offenders – youth and social workers, psychologists, educators, etc.
